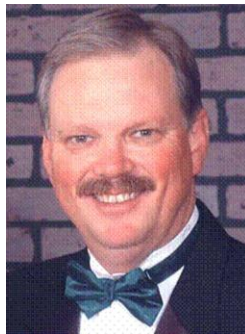

How Can MRP Help Improve Scheduling of Operator and Machine Certifications, Calibrations, and Maintenance?

Many of our companies must maintain operator certifications, machine certifications, and calibrations of machines. Most of our companies also have some type of preventive maintenance plan in place for our machines and tools. In some cases these things are required for government/military, regulatory, aerospace or other industry standards and qualifications. Undocumented or past due certifications and calibrations may cost thousands of dollars in lost production time or wasted materials. Missed preventive maintenance on a machine may shut down the factory.

Performing operator certifications/calibrations and preventive maintenance requires shop capacity and/or purchased or manufactured materials just as any other product would. In addition, most of these programs require some sort of formal procedures or documentation and may require quality approval.

If you do not have a formal plant and equipment planning system or a formal learning management system for your human resources, you can accomplish the tasks of planning and scheduling your capacity and material, documenting and following formal procedures using your existing MRP system! It can work like this.

- Create a part number for the operator such as "Tebow 1111" or for a machine "Oven 1111"
- Assign the part numbers for certifications and calibrations to a commodity code planner such as "Certification" or "Calibration"
- Create a part number for preventive maintenance on a particular machine such as "BPMill #9"
- Assign the part numbers for preventive maintenance to a commodity code planner such as "PM"
- Create Bills of Material for these "operator certification", "machine calibration" or "Preventive Maintenance" part numbers. The BOMS would consist of any materials or test parts or maintenance parts that you needed MRP to plan for.....just like any other part.
- Create shop routings for these "operator certification", "machine calibration", or "Preventive Maintenance" part numbers. These routings would have the standard times and work centers that are required to complete the certifications, calibrations or maintenance.
- Create a Master Schedule for the each "part" you would like MRP to plan and schedule. This MPS could stretch as far as you need into the future.
- Use MRP for planning and scheduling of work orders for certifications, calibrations and maintenance. The work orders provide a formal document to issue parts and material to, to charge time to and record data. These work orders become a place to collect costs for the certifications, calibrations and maintenance (Cost of Quality)

Using this approach will allow you to formally plan and schedule the need for operators to re-certify equipment or processes, machine certifications/qualifications, and preventive maintenance. Required parts/materials and capacity will be planned and allocated ahead of when you need them. You will have a formal record of the activity with the work order record (printed or paperless) and you will have a tool for collecting cost of quality. The Master Schedule and MRP will not allow you to "overlook" these requirements and will assist you with exception messages and actions messages by commodity code so that these requirements are completed on time to keep your operations up to date and running smooth!

APICS Educational Notes

- APICS current policy does not have an expiration date on CPIM exams taken, therefore, there is no limit how long a candidate for CPIM can take to become certified. As of January 2013, there will be a 10 year window of opportunity to get certified. That is, tests passed will expire and will not count toward CPIM after 10 years. This should not be a problem for our chapter, as most folks get certified within 1-3 years of taking the first exam.
- The CSCP retake policy is that you can re-take the exam after 14 days if the CSCP “window” of examinations is still open. The CPIM policy has been that you had to wait 30 days to re-take and exam. **The CPIM policy has been revised. You can now re-take CPIM exams after a 14 day waiting period.**



Guaranteed Schedule for CPIM Courses Accelerated & Weekly Versions

Again this year we will be offering a chance to sign up for the CPIM certification courses at one time and be assured that the classes would not be cancelled. Here is how it will work:

- The program will consist of all five of the CPIM modules, unless you have already started taking courses, in which case your fees will be adjusted.
- One price will include all five-course fees and exam vouchers and all five participant workbooks \$2500 for APICS Members and \$2700 for Non-Members.

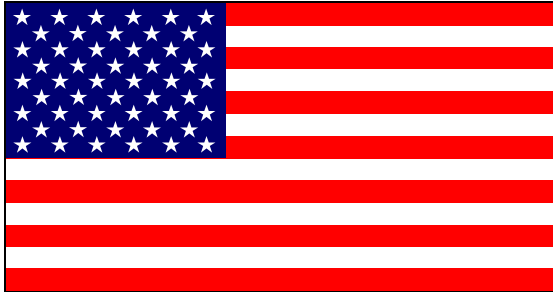
